Plants suited to coastal gardens are often fire-retardant and suitable for fire-prone areas, particularly those with thick, fleshy leaves.

What is a Coastal Garden?

Creating a garden along the coast can be a challenge, particularly with sandy, nutrient-poor soils and damaging salt winds. However, there are many attractive local plants that have adapted to these harsh conditions and when planted in your garden will really thrive.

Enhance your sandy soil by incorporating organic matter or a local landscape supplier's soil compost mix, and mulch the surface. This improves soil structure and moisture retention. Protect delicate plants from salt winds by planting larger coastal shrubs and small trees along the garden's perimeter.
